AUTOMATIC PAYMENT PLAN

Our Automatic Payment Plan is a means by which your utility payment can be automatically deducted from your checking or savings account each month. The payment will automatically be applied to your utility account and all you need to do is deduct the amount from your account balance each month on the due date.

With the Automatic Payment Plan you can save on postage, gasoline, and time. Your payment will always be on time, so you will never receive a late payment charge. You can take advantage of this program at no cost to you.

To get started on the Automatic Payment Plan, simply fill out the form below authorizing your bank, credit union, or savings and loan to automatically deduct the amount of your Sturgeon Bay Utilities (SBU) bill from your account each month. Return the form, along with a voided check or appropriate savings account information, to the SBU office. Once processed, the deduction will be made on the due date printed on your bill.
